

2 more potential senatorial candidates

Two potential senatorial candidates are the latest to pick up packets from the Guam Election Commission, bringing the total number of those thinking about running for senator to 55, as of Friday.

Former Yona Mayor Ken Joe Ada, a Republican, picked up his packet last week. Ada was mayor of the southern village from 2013 to 2016, according to the Mayors' Council of Guam. He did not seek re-election. James Barnhart, a Democrat, also picked up a packet.

There are now 22 Republicans, 29 Democrats and four without declared party affiliations potentially eyeing

seats in the Guam Legislature.

The Guam Election Commission will begin accepting nominating petitions and candidate packets on April 17. The deadline to file candidacy is June 26.

Eight of the Legislature's 15 seats are open. Democratic Speaker Benjamin Cruz and Sen. Tom Ada, as well as Republican Sens. Fernando Esteves and Tommy Morrison announced they wouldn't be seeking re-election.

Democratic Sen. Michael San Nicolas is running for Guam's congressional delegate seat, and fellow Democratic

Sens. Frank Aguon Jr. and Dennis Rodriguez Jr. are running for governor. All other incumbent senators have picked up packets except Vice Speaker Therese Terlaje.

The primary election is scheduled for Aug. 25, and the general election is set for Nov. 6.

More funding

This election season will receive a boost as the election commission was recently granted \$600,000 as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2018, according to GEC Executive Director Maria Pangelinan.

The Guam Election Commission will meet with the U.S. Election Assistance Commission in the coming weeks to discuss how to access the federal

financial assistance, Pangelinan said, adding that she and her staff are still deciding what to use the money for.

Pangelinan said her staff has "preliminary plans" to present to the national commission for approval, but declined to share those proposals.

The funding will be used to support 2018 elections, including to improve the administration of elections, enhance technology and provide election security improvements," according to a release from the office of Del. Madeleine Bordallo.

"Voters must have full confidence in the integrity of their ballot, and these funds will ensure the security of our local elections," Bordallo stated.
